| General<br>Information     | Alabama gives employers' broad discretion to implement drug testing programs, including random testing, post-accident testing, and testing based on reasonable suspicion, but employers must still comply with federal regulations and employee rights.  Remember, establishing robust documentation is a key risk mitigant for employers in states like the Alabama. |

| Safety Sensitive Positions | If impairment could lead to significant harm to employees, customers, or the public, such as those involving operating heavy machinery or handling hazardous materials.   |
| Privacy Laws               | protects the confidentiality of drug test results, limiting access and prohibiting their use in criminal proceedings, but employers can still take employment actions based on positive results.  |
