- The lead researcher emphasized that these numbers point to recent and significant marijuana use: "This isn't about residual use; it's about recent consumption." Those consuming marijuana close to driving (or working) are clearly at a higher risk of accidents and fatalities.
- Medical experts continue to stress that any level of THC—even below legal limits—compromises
 reaction time, judgment, and coordination. This means workers who are "legally" under the limit
 may still be impaired and pose real safety risks to themselves and others.
